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MERCI, MAESTRO!

1. Press Release

The 9th edition of our competition « Merci, Maestro! » will take place at the Piano's Maene's concert room, from April 9th to April 12th, 2025 and will end by a Gala concert on April 13th 2025 at the Gothic room of the City Hall of Brussels.

Organized by Nataliya Chepurenko, founder of the Brussels International Music Academy, « Merci Maestro! » welcomes international and Belgian pianists under 25 years old to participate. This event provides a platform for intercultural exchange, giving artistes the opportunity to be known in Europe and abroad.

"Merci, Maestro!" also provides a possibility to create a new space to share classical music during the competition, from April 9th to April 12th, 2025, and during the Gala Concert on April 13th, 2025.

For nine consecutive years, the international competition « Merci, Maestro! » gives an opportunity to young pianists to perform in front of a jury composed of world famous musicians. This event also provides chances for every talent to win prestigious prizes and, for some of them, to win opportunities to participate in other festivals or concerts.

The inscriptions, closed on the 1st of March, will give us a first glimpse of this edition. With a great international diversity, this competition attracts more and more candidates every year. After the pre-selections (via videos), around twenty candidates per category (under 10 years old, 11-13 years old, 14-16 years old, 17-19 years old, 20-22 years old and 23-25 years old) will be selected, coming from more than 20 different countries.

In 2025, the jury will meet under the presidency of the Belgo-Ukrainian pianist, Nataliya Chepurenko, artistic director and founder of the competition « Merci, Maestro! ».

Nataliya Chepurenko (Belgium /Ukraine), president of the jury, artistic director and founder of the competition « Merci, Maestro! ». Founder, director, piano teacher and chamber music teacher of the « Brussels International Music Academy » and of the festival « Music Academy Forte ».

Jean-Claude Vanden Eynden (Belgium), honorary professor at the Royal Conservatory of Brussels and Master in Residence at the Queen Elisabeth Music Chapel.

Pietro Sellito (Italy), teacher at the Italian public school and director of chamber, choral and orchestral music, in Italy and abroad.

Lyudmyla Zakopets (Ukraine), professor of piano at the Lviv State Music Lyceum named after Solomiya Krushelnytska.

Michail Markov (Netherlands)

M. Markov is the founder and the artistic leader of the International Piano Competition for Young Musicians in Enschede, The Netherlands.

Tatiana Kozlova (Israel), professor of piano at the Israeli Conservatory of Music in Tel Aviv. Artistic director of "Stretto international piano competition" in Tel-Aviv.

Tamara Kordzadze (Switzerland), professor of piano at the Zurich Conservatory. President of Association "Unite Classics" and "Vivace". Jury Member at international Competitions.

Milana Chernyavska (Germany), professor of piano at the University of Music and Performing Arts Graz (Austria).

Organized over 5 days, from April 9th to April 13th, 2025, this edition offers the musicians a look back at the work of J.S-Bach, Haydn, Beethoven, Mozart, and many others. The two rounds of the competition will take place in Piano's Maene's concert room, in Brussels, and they are open to the public.

The competition will end with a Gala Concert for all the winners. This Gala Concert will take place on April 13th, 2025, at the City Hall of Brussels.







2. PROGRAM

The International Competition for Young Pianists « Merci, Maestro! » is open for pianists from all around the world and is organized in six categories. The finalists will be announced after every performance of each category.

- Category A: for candidates younger than 10 years old (inclusive) at the first day of the Competition, that is 11th April 2025.
- Category B: for candidates from 11 to 13 years old (inclusive) at the first day of the Competition, that is 11th April 2025.
- Category C: for candidates from 14 to 16 years old (inclusive) at the first day of the Competition, that is 10th April 2025
- Category D: for candidates from 17 to 19 years old (inclusive) at the first day of the Competition, that is 10th April 2025
- Category E: for candidates from 20 to 22 years old (inclusive at the first day of the Competition, that is 9th April 2025.
- Category F: for candidates from 23 to 25 years old (inclusive) at the first day of the Competition, that is 9th April 2025.

1. JURY MEMBERS BIOGRAPHIES

Nataliya Chepurenko (Belgium/Ukraine)

President of jury, founder, artistic director and founder of the competition "Merci, Maestro!". Founder, director, piano & chamber music teacher of the "Brussels International Music Academy". Founder, artistic director, piano & chamber music teacher of the festival & masetarclasses "Music Academy FORTE". Master in Piano Performing, Teaching and Chamber Music graduated from the Tchaikovsky Conservatory in Kiev, Ukraine; the Royal Conservatory of Liege and the Royal Conservatory of Brussels, Belgium. Jury member at many International piano competitions, member of EPTA, and ballet pianist. For several years main pianist of the Royal Ballet of Flanders and « Brussels International Ballet School », guest pianist at many international ballet companies. Jury member of several international competitions.

Jean-Claude Vanden Eynden (Belgium)

Honorary Professor at the Royal Conservatory of Brussels and Master in Residence at the Queen Elisabeth Music Chapel. Frequently performed in chamber music formation with musicians such as José Van Dam, Augustin Dumay, Miriam Fried, Silvia Marcovici, Gérard Caussé, Michaela Martin, Walter Boeykens, Frans Helmerson, the quartet Ysaÿe, the quartet Melos and the quartet Enesco. Vanden Eynden was often a jury member in international competitions, primarily on the jury of the International Queen Elisabeth Competition. He was also artistic advisor for some festivals such as in Stavelot. He built a solid career as an international soloist. At the same time he was a professor at the Royal Music Academy in Brussels and at the Queen Elisabeth Music Chapel. He was also artistic director of the European Center Eduardo Del Pueyo.

Pietro Sellitto (Italy)

Currently, Sellitto is a teacher at the Italian public school. In 2024 he published his book "La Musica come rimedio alla Malinconia" which is achieving great success by selling hundreds of copies all over Italy. He is also a director of chamber, choral and orchestral music, in Italy and abroad. Founder of the Accademia Musicale Nocera and president of the Associazione di Cultura Musicale di Sant' Anna in Nocera Inferiore (SA)- at the moment known as Associazione Musica Nova-, since 2013, he is also the organizer of many significant cultural events during which renowned artist of the opera, classical and contemporary music world are involved.

Graduated in Piano at the Conservatory "Carlo Gesualdo Da Venosa" in Potenza; subsequently he gained a specialized degree cum Laude in Musical Disciplines at the Conservatory "G. Martucci" of Salerno. Since he was a child, he was seen as an outstanding musical talent.

In partnership with the soprano Annunziata D'Alessio and the administration of municipality of Nocera, he designed a prestigious competition: the CIMN- Concorso Internazionale Musicale Nocera which has reached its fourth edition and has had as jury members renowned artist of the international piano scene, such as Olga Zdorenko.

Lyudmyla Zakopets (Ukraine)

From 1989 up till now Lyudmyla Zakopets has been working as a piano teacher in Lviv State Music Lyceum named after Solomiya Krushelnytska. She graduated Chernivtsi Music College in

1984 (class by Prasol M.I) and Tchaikovsky National Music Academy of Ukraine (class by prof.Vitte N.M.) in 1989 with honors.Lyudmyla Zakopets has been coordinator and professor of international piano forum "Beshchady bez kordoniv" in Ukraine.

Thanks to creative cooperation with Ya.Dzhevietskyi and Ya. Ostrovskyi near 300 young pianists every year for 20 years have performed on the Forum stage and took part in workshops of provident educators. Lyudmyla Zakopets is an organizator and director of the first international young pianist competition "Feurich-virtuos" in Lviv and "Bechstein". Over the years of teaching, the achievements are: 90 prizewinners of international and national competitions, 40 performances with symphonic and chamber orchestras in Ukraine, Germany, Poland, Slowenijas.

Many of Lyudmyla Zakopets' students continued the studies in Music Academies in Ukraine (Lviv, Kyiv) Poland (Krakow, Bydgosz) Austria (Graz) Spain (Barcelona). Lyudmyla was invited to "Dora Schwarzberg summer international music school" as a teacher, offen conducts master classes in Ukraine and abroad. Also worked as a member of jury of international and Ukrainian competitions. Lyudmyla is awarded with diploma by Ministry of Culture and "Achievement Medal" of Ukrainian and from Poland.

Michail Markov (Netherlands)

M. Markov is the founder and the artistic leader of the International Piano Competition for Young Musicians in Enschede, The Netherlands. Since 1991, the musician has been living in the Netherlands where he has continued his successful combination of teaching and musical performances. M. Markov has made CD recordings in France and Germany. Since mid-nineties he is working as professor at the piano department of the ArtEZ Conservatory in Enschede, the Netherlands. M. Markov is also the co-founder of the special Young Talents piano department of this Conservatory. M. Markov has been invited to give Master Classes at many International Music Festivals and Summer Schools in the Netherlands, USA, Austria, Poland and Ukraine.

Tatiana Kozlova (Israel)

Professor of piano at the Israeli Conservatory of Music in Tel-Aviv. Artistic director of "Stretto international piano competition" in Tel-Aviv. Previously artistic director of Scherzo international piano competition. Teaches constantly around the globe in different master classes: Elena Cobb Star Music Festival, Musicfest Perugia, Carmel Klavier International Piano competition. Master in Piano Performing, Teaching and Chamber Music graduated from Tchaikovsky National Academy of Music in Kiev, Ukraine. Touring career: performing at various international festivals and competition in Lithuania, Poland, Holland, Greece and Belgium. Jury member in various piano competitions.



Tamara Kordzadze (Switzerland)

Teaching at the Zurich Conservatory and her piano class counts over 53 Prizewinners of international and national piano competitions. President of Association "Unite Classics". Founder and president of "Vivace" – an association that promotes and supports musically talented children and adults in Georgia. Was co-founder, board member, and head of international relationships of the association « Youth Classics » and « International Music Week Montepulciano » from 2009 to 2014. Leading two associations, successfully working on over 30 projects, and helping over 200 young musicians gave Tamara Kordzadze substantial experience and ultimately led to the « Unite Classics » Association in order to make classical music accessible to a wider, new audience with innovative projects. Tamara has been distinguished and has won prizes – including 1st prizes – at numerous national and international piano competitions.

Milana Chernyavska (Germany)

Professor of Piano at the University of Music and Performing Arts Graz (Austria). She leads numerous international masterclasses worldwide. A German artist with Ukrainian roots. Looking back at her impressive career, she established herself as one of the leading pianists and pedagogues of our times. Her critics agree with Alfred Brendel, who wrote that "Happiness was complete when one listened to Milana Chernyavska". Since 2009 she is a piano professor at the University of Music and Performing Arts in Graz, Austria. Milana Chernyavska is a sought-after teacher at international master classes as well as a jury member at various prestigious piano competitions, such as the ARD in Munich, the Busoni Competition, Telekom Beethoven Competition in Bonn, the Mozart Competition in Salzburg, the Santa Cecilia in Porto Competition or the Bluethner Goldaward in Vienna.

- Certificate of participation will be issued to participants, who were not selected to the final round, in the evening after the announcement of the first-round results at the secretary office of the competition.
- All works must be performed by memory without scores and without repetition.
- Changes in the repertoire will not be allowed after the registration at the competition.
- The prize-winners commit themselves to giving a benefit concert for the Competition.
- All winners will receive diplomas and prizes in cash at the Gala concert.
- If the winner is not present at the GALA concert the prizes and diplomas will not be delivered
- The candidates have to be present minimum 30 minutes before the performance.
- If the candidate is a student of one of the jury members, this jury member cannot vote.
- The candidate who already received one prize cannot participate one more time in the same category.
- The public is prohibited from photographing or filming during the performances. The organiser of the Competition has the right to do and reproduce pictures, video and audio recordings, as well as broadcasting on the radio and TV channels.
- Members of the Jury are musicians and teachers with worldwide reputation.

- Decisions of the jury are irrevocable. Only the members of the Jury shall be competent for any dispute. Their decisions are irrevocable and should not be justified. The members of the jury can possibly decide not to give any prize in one category. If two candidates end up at the same place, the President of the Jury will decide about the winner.
- The « Merci, Maestro! » competition reserves the right, without payment of fees, to record and distribute recordings for media and other purposes, including on the internet and television, broadcast, film, record, videotape, photograph or live stream all stages of the competition, all prize performances and concerts.
- The « Merci, Maestro! » competition reserves the right to change the conditions and rules in the interest of the competition.
- In case of refusal of the candidate to participate in the competition, the registration fee will not be refunded.
- All the pieces chosen by the candidates themselves must be accepted by the Jury and published in a repertoire.
- The announcement of each category's finalists will take place after the appearance of all the candidates of the category (at the end of the day).
- The order of the candidates is organised in alphabetical order. Nevertheless, the organiser of the Competition has the right to modify their order.
- The organiser of the competition is not responsible for any physical or material damages that could result from the participation at the contest.
- Each participant is responsible for their personal medical insurance, risk and personal belongings insurance.
- No music by Russian composers can be performed during the competition.
